IL Valley Center for Independent Living

I talked about serving on the Illinois Valley Center for Independent Living in one of my past newsletter articles, and some residents expressed interest in learning more.

The five core services provided by Centers for Independent Living (CILs) are: information and referral, individual and systems advocacy, peer counseling, independent living skills training, and transition services for those in nursing homes. These services are federally funded through a nationwide program designed to empower individuals with disabilities to live independently and participate fully in their communities.

In Illinois, every county is served by a CIL. Our CIL covers a five-county area, so we offer satellite offices in Henry, Streator, and Stark County, in addition to our main office in Spring Valley. We are currently ranked number one in the state for remodeling the most homes for accessibility and for providing the most accessible phones. This is very exciting for a small, rural office.

Recently, my Executive Director and I, in my role as board chair, had the opportunity to present to the National Center for Independent Living—a wonderful recognition for our rural area. As a national program serving people with disabilities, it was inspiring to see how much work goes on behind the scenes to provide closed captioning and sign language interpretation in both English and Spanish to ensure accessibility for all. I was able to speak about the importance of recruiting board members or employees with disabilities—since that is a requirement for CILs—as well as advocacy, peer support, and making paperwork and language more accessible for people with disabilities. You never know when your life experience might help someone else.

I was honored to share my lived experience to help others on a national level and am grateful that Greenfield gives us the opportunity to serve our communities in ways that excite us.

Our Greenfield Greeters serve a similar role. You never know when your smile, greeting, or a bag of popcorn might just make someone's day. We should always be open to new opportunities to serve our community—no matter our age or ability.


